The rental fee for non-residents is \$80 per time slot (9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. or 4:30 – 9:00 p.m.) throughout the week. Even though you may have a Pickerington mailing address, or live within the Pickerington School District, you may not necessarily live within the Pickerington City limits.

- Single Youth:** Must be between the ages of 12 and 17 to be eligible for a single youth pass.

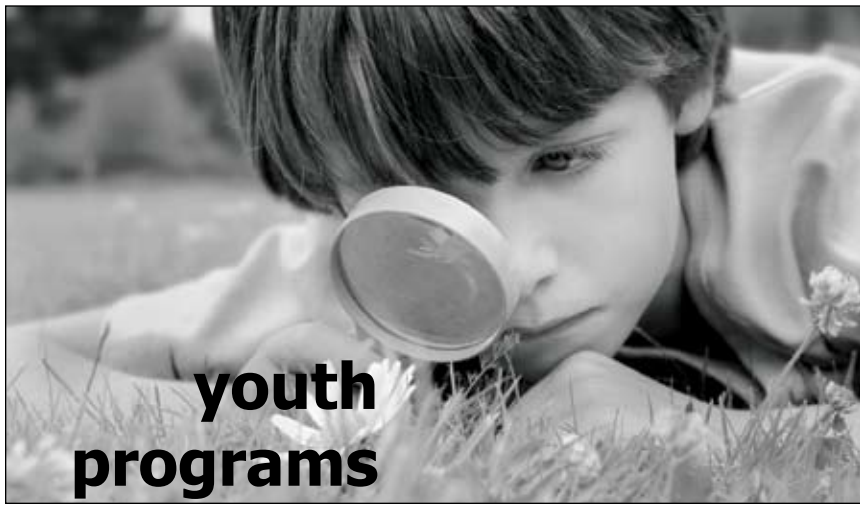

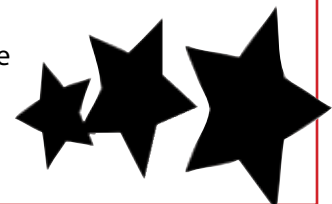
